# **Real-World Evidence Research Proposal Competition**

**SISPE 2024** 

#### Goals

- 1) Foster student collaboration
- 2) Advance pharmacoepidemiology proposal writing skills
- 3) Promote student engagement with the ISPE
- 4) Help students develop a rigorous research proposal that they will go on to complete

### **Competition Overview**

- Competitors will assemble a team of up to three students
- Teams will submit research proposal on any topic of interest that uses real-world data
  - o Proposal will include introduction, specific Aims, methods, and limitations sections
  - Three-page limit for proposal
- Pharmacoepidemiology experts will review and score proposals
- The team with the highest score wins!

### **Timeline**

- Announce competition at MYM April 14-16<sup>th</sup>
- Students submit their teams by May 15<sup>th</sup>
- Proposals due June 15<sup>th</sup>
- Distribute proposals to reviewers by June 20<sup>th</sup>
- Reviewers' scores due by July 20<sup>th</sup>
- Notify winners August 1<sup>st</sup> and provide all competitors with their feedback
- Announce 1<sup>st</sup> place and runner up teams publicly at ICPE Aug 24-28<sup>th</sup>

### Incentives to compete

- Grand Prize, **TBD** possibilities include:
  - o Registration at ICPE, 1 year of membership
  - Publication (abstract of best proposal gets published)
- Other
  - Recognition for 1<sup>st</sup> place and runner up teams
  - All competing teams will receive critical feedback from pharmacoepidemiology experts on their research proposal

- Develop scoring /review rubrics
- Identify reviewers
  - ICPE education committee
- Find a web portal or other platform to submit:
  - Names of team members
  - Completed research proposals
  - Reviewer scores and feedback

## **Competition Rules**

- Teams
  - Teams can consist of up to three students
    - Members must be students throughout the duration of the competition, students completing their degree before proposal submission are not eligible
  - At least one student must be a member of ISPE
- Registration
  - o Teams must register using the registration form by the enrollment deadline
  - No late registrations will be allowed
- Proposal
  - Proposals are due 11:59 PM (EST) on TBD DATE XX/xx/XXXX
  - o Proposals are limited to 3 pages and should include:
    - Background/Introduction
    - Specific aims and hypotheses
    - Methods
    - Limitations
  - Formatting
    - 11-point font
    - Arial, Georgia, Helvetica, Palatino Linotype
    - One-inch margins
  - Figures
    - Figures are allowed, but are included in the overall page count
- Scoring
  - Reviewers will score submissions using
    - NIH Scoring rubrics
    - ISPE Abstract review standards
    - Other?
  - All proposals will be scored by two experts on the judging panel
    - Judges will provide critical feedback in addition to scores
